Mary's Woods ahead of schedule

Touted as well ahead of schedule, Mary's Woods at Marylhurst continues to progress on 28 acres of land facing Highway 43 near West Linn. Designed by architects Mithun of Seattle and under the direction of general contractor Andersen Construction Co. of Portland, the project is representative of a national trend in senior living. Expected to begin accommodating residents as early as April 2001, Mary's Woods will offer 226 independent living apartments and villas and 50 assisted living units. The project also contains 45 health care beds that offer a mix of skilled nursing and specialty care. In addition, Andersen Construction is renovating a circa-1910 onsite building that will provide apartments for project owner The Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary.
