


MARY'S WOODS AT MARYLHURST RETIREMENT COMMUNITY Lake Oswego, Ore.

Mary's Woods at Marylhurst Retirement Community



ndersen Construction partnered with The Weitz Company Inc. of Des Moines, Iowa, on the Mary's Woods retirement community, a \$56 million project in Lake Oswego, Ore.

The community will combine housing and health services on a 28-acre site and include 266 independent living apartments and villas, a health care center with 50 assisted living units, 45 health care beds (23 skilled nursing and 22 specialty care), a commons area and a wellness center.

The project includes construction of four new mid-rise buildings with underground parking, 33 new villas and renovating and seismically upgrading the 90-year-old existing Marylhurst Provincial House. The scheduled completion date is early 2001.

Andersen's partner, The Weitz Company Inc., is a full-service general contractor, design-builder and construction manager. The firm was ranked 26th among the nation's building contractors by Engineering News-Record for 1999. The company is growing, recently acquiring two companies: Fairway Construction, a golf course builder in Temecula, Calif.; and Abell-Howe, an industrial construction company in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

The project owner is Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. Mithun Partners of Seattle is the architect and the civil engineer is WRG Design of Portland. Kramer Gehlen of Portland is the structural engineer, MacDonald Miller of Seattle is the mechanical engineer and Travis, Fitzmaurice and Associates of Seattle is the electrical engineer.
